Pupil Uniform Policy

The Governing Body of the school determines the uniform policy and it is the responsibility of the Principal and teachers to ensure that all students keep to the rules.

It is the parents and students' responsibility to arrive at school wearing the correct uniform and that it is appropriate for the weather conditions.

Wearing of a school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school
- Is practical, smart and affordable
- Identifies students of the school and fosters a sense of community
- Promotes equality amongst the students in terms of their appearance

PARK SCHOOL UNIFORM

- School blazer with badge
- School jumper navy
- White shirt
- School tie KS3/4 Navy with light blue/Green stripe.
 Post 16 Navy with light blue/yellow stripe
- Grey trousers or navy skirt
- Black leather school shoes (No trainers or boots)

PE KIT

- Park School PE Polo Shirt
- Park School PE Shorts/tracksuit bottoms
- Park School PE hoodie
- Trainers

On your child's PE day they are to come to school wearing their PE kit. Students are **not** permitted to wear any other PE kit.

SCHOOL BAGS

Students must come to school with an appropriate sized waterproof bag for carrying school books and equipment. No school bags associated with any sporting teams are permitted in school.

JEWELLERY

A wristwatch and 1 pair of stud earrings only

*No other items of jewellery or piercings are permitted.

ACCESSORIES, MAKE UP AND HAIRSTYLES

No accessories to the school uniform are permitted. These include but are not limited to: sunglasses, hair decorations, wristbands, badges/brooches and hats.

Woollen hats may be worn to and from school in the winter but **must not** be worn inside the building.

Hairstyles should not be extreme in appearance nor of outrageous design, nor shaven.

All colour of hair is to be of a natural shade.

Excessive make-up is not allowed in school. Students may be required to remove excessive make-up before commencing school.

Nail polish should be restricted to neutral shades and no false nails or extensions should be worn at any time.
